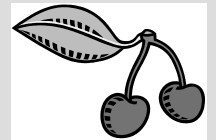

The language of flowers, sometimes called florigraphy, was a Victorian-era means of communication in which various flowers and floral arrangements were used to send coded messages, allowing individuals to express feelings which otherwise could not be spoken. Floral artist **Deb Wallig** (owner, Heath Florist in Salem) will demonstrate an arrangement using colorful spring blooms and greenery during a sumptuous three course high tea. One lucky guest will take home an arrangement created during the tea. A tour of the house will be offered following the tea.

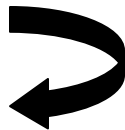
